Attendance and Punctuality

All students are expected to attend morning registration at 8.50am daily.

Parents / carers should always telephone school by 9.30am to report illness / a reason for absence.

"Wise up" to Attendance



Attendance excellent 97%

+ = 6 days absent per year



Attendance <u>Good</u> 95%+ = less than 10 days absence per year



Attendance 90-95% = up to 20 days absent per year.

Needs Improvement



Attendance 80-90% = up to 40 days off per year.

NOT GOOD ENOUGH



Below 80% = Unacceptable parents could be prosecuted

What school can do to help students and parents improve attendance:

- We can keep you informed of your child's attendance and will contact you if concerned.
- We can arrange for you to come into school and meet your child's head of year and our education welfare officer.
- We can reward yours child's good attendance.
- We run attendance panels.
- We can have someone at the end of the telephone who can help you.
- We can involve the education welfare officer.

What parents can do to help

Parents should only allow time off school for serious and important reasons. Make certain that wherever possible medical and dental appointments are out of school hours

Avoid absence of leave in term time. If unavoidable you must complete an absence of leave form, from school four weeks in advance.

The head teacher will decide if absence of leave in term time can be authorized. If your child's absence is unavoidable please contact the school before 9.30am and leave a message.

Always make sure that your child has a note which explains their absence and that the note is brought back to school on the first day back after the absence.

If you are concerned about your child's

attendance please contact either the Education welfare officer or your child's head of year.

What is the Law on Attendance?

Parents/Carers have to make sure that children of school age (i.e. 4-16 years) receive full-time education.



They must make sure that children on roll at school attend regularly.

Parents may be taken to court for breaking the law.

Under the 1996 Education Act section 444, parents may be fined up to £2,500, face 3 months in prison or receive a parenting order.

Under the Anti Social Behaviour Act 2003 parents may receive a fixed penalty notice of up to £120

It is vital that each student attends school daily with as little absence as possible. There is a clear and direct relationship between school attendance and performance in formal examinations.
